




PREPARING FOR COLLEGE

Dormitory Guidelines

1. Dormitory rooms are furnished by the college so that each student has a bed, a wardrobe for hanging clothes, and some shelf and drawer space in a dresser. Each room also has at least one desk and chair.
2. Students may bring a bookshelf (without doors) so long as it is not more than twelve inches deep and three feet wide.
3. Students are allowed to have a storage unit no larger than a standard two-drawer file cabinet.
4. Students who have a desktop computer may have a small computer table on which to place it.
5. Students may not bring into the rooms additional furniture such as, but not limited to: floor lamps, pole lamps, room partitions, chairs, sofas or desks.

6. No furniture in the room may be moved, nor may any be added without approval of the dormitory supervisor.
7. Any extension cord used in the dormitories must have a circuit breaker built in the extension cord.
8. Refrigerators may be no more than 33 inches tall and must be kept clean. Only one refrigerator per room will be permitted.
9. No weights are allowed in the dormitories.
10. A student's name must be posted at the end of his bed.

11. All food in the dormitories must be kept in sealed plastic or metal containers.

12. Nothing may be attached to the dormitory wall by the use of nails, screws, tacks, glue, tape or staples. The only approved method for attaching things to the dormitory walls is "plastic tack."



(Monetary fees for wall damage will be assessed based on the extent of the damage)

13. Dirty clothes must be kept in a sealed container. There must be no holes.
14. Televisions are not permitted in the dormitories.
15. The college will provide a phone in each dormitory room. Students may not replace these phones with personal phones, nor attach the phone line in the dorm to an answering machine, computer, or other phone without the permission of the administration.
